**1. Courtyard Garden**

*Wisteria sinensis* — Chinese Wisteria (planted by Howard Van Vleck in 1939)

**2. Formal Garden**

The Van Vleck Rhododendrons:

*Rhododendron* 'Howard Van Vleck'

*Rhododendron* 'Betty Van Vleck'

*Cedrus libani* — Cedar of Lebanon

The formal perennial beds were completely replanted in 2004.

**3. Around the House**

*Magnolia grandiflora* 'Edith Bogue' — Edith Bogue Magnolia

**4. Azalea Walk**

*Rhododendron vaseyi* 'White Find' — White Find Azalea

**5. Rear Garden**

*Metasequoia glyptostroboides* — Dawn Redwood

*Rhododendron fortunei* — Fortune Rhododendron

*Rhododendron keiskei* — Keiskei Rhododendron

*Cedrus atlantica glauca* — Blue Atlas Cedar

**6. Carriage House & Greenhouses**

The Carriage House Greenhouse contains orchids and other flowering plants, and is open M-F 8 am – 3 pm. The new greenhouse is used for propagation and is open for educational workshops.

**7. Woodlands Garden**

This area is under redevelopment after a 97 storm destroyed it.

**8. Mother's Garden & Upper Lawn**

Historic site of 59 Upper Mountain Avenue, the Van Vleck's Tudor style home with formal gardens. The home was demolished in the 1960's.

**9. Tennis Court Pergola**

*Wisteria floribunda* — Japanese Wisteria

**10. The Drying Yard**

*Enkianthus perulatus* — White Enkianthus
